July 18th has been designated by Cumbria in Bloom as the day when Windermere and Bowness will be judged in the Town category.

Windermere in Bloom, endorsed the bу Windermere and Bowness Chamber of Trade. encourages both businesses and residents to put on a show worthy of the Gold certificate and Best in Borough awarded last year. It would be an achievement if the community could also add 'best in county' to this impressive array awards.

The designated judges from the north-west of the county will be looking at 3 core are:

Horticultural Achievement

Environmental Responsibility

C o m m u n i t y Participation

These three core principles underline every aspect of the marking and the judges marking sheet is broken down to include them all.

<u>Section A</u> - Horticultural Achievement (50%) In

this section the judges will be looking for year-round horticulture focusing on five key areas:

- A1. Impact
- A2. Horticultural Practice
- A3. Residential and community gardening
- A4. Business areas and premises
- A5. Green spaces

Section B - Environmental Responsibility (25%). This section should show the judges year-round a c h i e v e m e n t encompassing care for the built environment:

- B1. Conservation and biodiversity
- B2. R e s o u r c e management
- B3. Local heritage
- B4. Local environmental quality
- B5. Pride of place

<u>Section C</u> - Community Participation (25%). This crucial to the success of the campaign and will be judged on the following:

- C1. Development and continuity
- C2. Communication and education

- C3. c o m m u n i t y involvement
- C4. Year-round involvement
- C5. Funding and support

As Cumbria in Bloom is a community-driven campaign, it is expected that a diverse range of local people will be involved and that there will be a broad-based public awareness and support.

The judging of the communities entry into the RHS 2013 Britain in Bloom will take place between the 29th July and the 9th August. The exact date has yet to be notified.

A number of freebees were handed out which included the new Elleray Wood information leaflet together with bookmarks and the last three editions of this newsletter.

Windermere in Bloom also had a display stand at the St. Mary's Windermere, Charity Day. This was manned by 2 members of the 'In Bloom' group.
