Your Priorities - What we did

Bowness North:

We continue to work with partner agencies, such as Young Cumbria, to engage the youth of the area with diversionary activities to keep them out of trouble. Football is restarting, though the First Gear project for young drivers is coming to an end.

Cycling Proficiency for the young is also set to begin, with about 80 in the area being taken through it this year. And Operation Trice is continuing, where the Police are checking car parks as valuables left in view are being targeted by criminals.

CRIMEMAPPING:

Overall crime shows a 47.1% reduction over the same period last year. Last month the only thing that really shows on the figures for Bowness North is 3 incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour. This has been due to a lot of work that Community Officers at Windermere working extensively with partner agencies as described in previously.

Anti-Social Behaviour and Underage drinking remain a high priority for us, especially now that the days are getting longer and it is getting warmer in the evenings.

Your Priorities - What we did

Bowness South:

Anti Social Behaviour in the Bowness South is often related to the pubs in the area. We are working with the local Barwatch to keep trouble to a minimum and to seek to ban persistent offenders.

Marine Watch is offering Police covers for outboard motors, priced £13-£35 dependant on size as a deterrent to the theft of outboards that occurred over the past 2 seasons.

As an added note: we seem to have our handbag thief back in the area, who likes to visit us on tourist weekends, so we would advise you to keep your valuables safe and not to leave your handbag discarded anywhere. If you see any thing suspicious, please contact us on 0845 33 00 247.

Crime In Your Area - Follow Up

CRIMEMAPPING:

Overall there has been a 23.4% drop in crime compared to the same period last year. We had no incidents of Burglary, Robbery or Violent crime recorded for the March period. There were however, 3 incidents of vehicle crime in the area and 14 Anti-Social Behaviour, though many of these are related to the night time drinking economy. We have noticed a decrease on the figures for this year since our local personality Ziggy left following his conviction for similar in February, leading him to be given an ASBO.

Increase attention will be given to underage drinking now that daylight hours are longer and we will continue to pursue littering and dog fouling with our partners in the SLDC, especially with early morning patrols.
