Your Priorities - What we did

Bowness North:

Following the latest KIN (Key Individual Network) for the area, your priorities have not changed over the last 6 months. Anti-Social Behaviour both youth and adult are both confronted whenever they are encountered. Underage drinking, especially around the rugby club for Bowness North is always a concern for us and residents nearby. Though incidents have dropped we still have patrols that give this area passing attention and local residents have been asked to give a ring

Dog fouling and littering, which is both anti-social and a health hazard, are ongoing issues. Both are subject to special patrols with South Lakeland Council enforcement officers but they are also things that officers in the area are also aware to look out for with fines for the offenders.

have been recorded in the last 3 months but that does not stop us asking that temptation not be put in burglars way over the festive season and that you ensure you secure you keep any possessions in house or car are locked away out of sight. Robbery is also non-existent as is vehicle crime. Violent crime has also fallen as has Anti-Social Behaviour which has shown a considerable drop.

Your Priorities - What we did

Bowness South:

For Bowness South the outlook is similar to the above but the areas of concern are different. We have been working with our partners in Environmental Health in regards to noise issues from the area of part of Ash St, which has been a concern of another establishment nearby. Anti-Social Behaviour has mainly not been attributed to youths as much as towards the vagrant members of our community.

Dog fouling and littering are also being looked at in a forthright manner. Both are anti-social and dog-fouling is also am major health hazard. Posters for dog-fouling have been placed in various locations and early morning patrols with South Lakeland enforcement officers have also taken place in this area too to catch and look to fining offenders.

The Force has introduced our Policing Pledge which is our commitment to the public, displayed alongside these posters. To this end in relation to the crime mapping figures, Bowness South shows the following: Burglary figures have risen slightly, which leads us to ask, like the above, that over the festive season we ask that you please secure all your possessions, either in house or car, and that they are out of plain sight. Robberies are thankfully non-existent. Vehicle crime has risen a little bit while violent crime has remained static as is Anti-Social Behaviour.
