Your Priorities - What we did

Bowness North:

Anti-Social Behaviour and Underage drinking are still a high level of concern for us. We have been called to various incidents in the area and continue to actively engage youth as part of our general evening patrols.

Dog-fouling occurrences seem to have reduced but still need further tackling. It is a general health hazard as most puppies and many adult dogs carry *Toxocara canis* parasites which can lead to blindness in people. We work with South Lakeland Council enforcement officers to patrol in the South Lakes area where litter and dog fouling is a concern to the community. People who fail to clear up after their dog can be fined for not doing so. We would urge that dog owners carry bags with them whenever they go out.

CRIMEMAPPING:

Crimemapping is a system of looking at the previous 3 months level of various crimes in comparison to the same period the year before:

Our Policing Pledge, which is displayed alongside these posters, includes a commitment to supply you with information about Neighbourhood Policing. The figures for this month show a reduction on the previous year. No burglaries have been recorded for the last 3 months. Vehicle crimes have fallen. Anti-Social Behaviour, which causes the most problems to the neighbourhood in general has reduced. If you feel the need to contact us for any reason we try to respond to your messages within 24 hours.

Bowness South:

Anti Social Behaviour comes in many forms, from youths causing disturbances to noise and drinking at various places in the Bowness area. We work with partner agencies such as South Lakeland Council and Environmental Health to respond to complaints.

As for Bowness North dog-fouling occurrences seem to have reduced but still need further tackling. We work with South Lakeland Council enforcement officers to patrol in South Lakes areas where litter and dog fouling is a concern to the community. People who fail to clear up after their dog can be fined for not doing so. We would urge that dog owners carry bags with them whenever they go out.

CRIMEMAPPING:

Crimemapping is a system of looking at the previous 3 months level of various crimes in comparison to the same period the year before:

Our Policing Pledge, which is displayed alongside these posters, includes a commitment to supply you with information about Neighbourhood Policing. We will let you know about meetings in your area where you can meet with local officers to discuss issues of concern. We will keep you updated on local crime and disorder. We will make regular contact with you if you are unfortunate enough to find yourself a victim. As for the crime figures: the number of burglary offences has risen, and we remind people to ensure your property is secured before you leave it and that nothing valuable is left in sight. Vehicle crime numbers shows no change from last year. Violent crime has fallen very slightly, and Anti-Social Behaviour has reduced.
