umbria Constabulary is committed to working closely with local people and communities to ensure that Cumbria remains one of the safest places to live, work and visit. This is achieved by our local neighbourhood policing team.



Neighbourhood policing teams work together with partners and communities to tackle the issues that local people have identified as priorities. The aim is to deliver a consistent level of service which is flexible enough to meet the needs of individual neighbourhoods.

Neighbourhood policing teams provide the first point of contact for local residents with non emergency issues and aim to create strong working relationships with local communities in Cumbria.

A neighbourhood team can be made up of police officers, special constables, police community support officers, community wardens, volunteers and partners, all working together in partnership to tackle local issues.
