Your Priorities - What we did

Windermere Town:

We have remained busy during the non-tourist months, working with partner agencies, especially Young Cumbria to give the youth of the area diversionary activities to keep them from becoming involved in Anti-Social Behaviour. The project First Gear is coming to an end but football will be re-starting soon. For the younger members we will be doing a lot of cycling proficiency in the area, with about 80 kids this term. Dog fouling and littering is still being targeted with us and the SLDC doing mobile patrols and more notices going up in the area.

Crime In Your Area - Follow Up

CRIMEMAPPING:

Overall crime figures for the area continue to show some variation. Windermere Town shows a 45.8% drop while Windermere Applethwaite shows a rise of 43.3%. This difference has been more to do with the sheer amount of thefts in one go at Limefit caravan park in January and when it drops off in the next month's figures there should be a little more clearer representation in the figures. To illustrate, last month Windermere Applethwaite only had 8 crimes listed, which while is 8 too many, is a low figure in respect to many other parts of the country.

For Windermere Town violent incidents are low, the

Operation Trice in relation to car crime in Car Parks is still ongoing. Please do not leave valuables in the open view to any perspective passing criminals who may be looking.

one incident of violence recorded in March was to do with a domestic incident. There was also only 9 incidents of Anti Social Behaviour, which compared to last year's figures for March of 17, shows a big fall. However we are not complacent and continue to work with our partner agencies to work with youths to keep this low, though we would also point out that not all anti-social behaviour is youth related.
