Windermere Town:

A recent community survey highlighted dog fouling and litter as your top priority. Police Community Support Officer Sarah Blacow has been working in partnership with South Lakeland District Council to discourage a minority of dog owners from committing offences. This together with an advertising campaign appears to be having the desired effect. However if you continue to witness such offences please inform your community team whose details can be found above.

On a separate note we continue to work with partners to provide diversionary activities for local youths thereby discouraging anti-social behaviour and encouraging positive behaviour. The younger members of the community get the chance to try

CRIMEMAPPING:

The community of Windermere continues to enjoy a low crime rate.

Statistically, when comparing the last three months of 2009 with the same period in 2008 there has been a 67.5% decrease in crime within the Windermere town ward.

In line with the 'Policing Pledge' we have been targeting resources to deal with local issues in your local area. The Christmas Respect campaign together with various youth initiatives has contributed towards a further reduction in anti-social behaviour by as much as 57.1% in the Windermere Applethwaite ward.

Unfortunately there were five incidents of violence in the


