And we're off!

Each LAP has now held at least two constructive meetings and has determined some initial areas for action as part of a prioritised action plan. Some have already started to deliver some of their main priorities. Getting information about current arrangements is proving to be a useful starting point for a number of issues. As you can imagine, highway maintenance is a popular priority for the LAPs. Other common issues include activities for young people and affordable housing.

Each partnership has either agreed, or is fine-tuning, a terms of reference and several are working on the best way to involve young people. Most have agreed to hold meetings in public and are beginning to think about how to work best with their Neighbourhood Forum. Most also want to review whether the LAP is making a difference in a year's time.

LAP Funds

The county and district councils have worked together to create a £15,000 budget for each LAP for tackling local priorities in 2010/11. This comes from both SLDC and CCC allowing £5,000 per LAP to be carried forward from last year and SLDC allocating another £5,000 for this year.

The County Council's Local Committee has also agreed a £20k project fund for LAPs for 2010/11 but no decision has yet been made on how that will be allocated. South Lakeland District Council has earmarked a capital sum for community projects and details on how this will operate will be shared with LAPs.

In addition, SLDC has a budget to pay for meeting costs and an administrator for each LAP. LAPs will soon have the opportunity to recruit this part-time administrator. This person will be a casual employee of South Lakeland District Council and the posts will be advertised through community networks in each LAP area.

In the Lead!

Sedbergh and Kirkby Lonsdale LAP is to be congratulated for the way it's started to tackle its priority of highways maintenance. When area engineer Keith Masser openly shared the county council's plans for the area, LAP members used their local knowledge to tweak them to better meet local need.

Meanwhile Kendal LAP has already secured funding to employ Action with Communities in Cumbria to develop a community engagement plan to support community-led planning for the town.

Grange and Cartmel is funding free transport for 11- 16 year olds in the board area for the easter and summer holidays
