Police:

The Secretary read out a report from Community Sergeant Bill Nolan. In it, it was reported that over the last month including Christmas there were 33 crimes reported of which 2 were for shoplifting and 2 were non dwelling burglaries. Thefts from hotels showed a slight rise but overall, Windermere and Bowness still remained a safe place to live, visit and work in.

Report/comments from the Windermere Town Council Representative:

Cllr. John Saunders reported that the Windermere Town Council had had a presentation from the planners regarding the development at Aquatics. The WTC were happy with the proposals.

The WTC had been approached by a company from Hull who stated that they had the go ahead to organise a 2014 Air Show by the lake. The Secretary made the meeting aware that he had the same company approach him in late 2013. Nothing had been heard since.

It had been proposed that the toilets at glebe Road Car Park may possibly be used as a small museum to celebrate the history of the "Water Bird."

Other points of interest mentioned were;

- Go-Lakes were establishing a 'hub' within the area.
- An architects 'photograph' for a bus shelter under the 'Porte Cochere' by Booths was shown.
 Comments were asked for and given by those assembled. These included;
 - Bad design stepped up to enclosed area
 - o Blocks pedestrian flow
 - Built round one of the pillar's holding up the Porte Cochere.
 - Appears not to have any seating
 - o Being built within the confines of a 'listed building.'

Chamber of Trade's focus for 2014:

The Chair outlined the proposed 'focuses for the Chamber during 2014. These were:

- Development of Ellerthwaite Square to accommodate the visitor better
- The overall issue of car parking
- Better signaging to Broad Street Car Park
