### Correspondence:

The Secretary read out the following correspondence that was not available on the website;

- a) A letter from the LDNPA notifying the Chamber of Trade that an appeal had gone in from the Old England Hotel, Bowness, regarding the plastic window. It was agreed by those present that the Chamber should respond on the lines it had done in notifying the LDNPA of the breach in planning control.
- b) An email from Richard Freeman regarding a simple survey on "How's Business." This was agreed to and left with the Secretary to devise such a form and either email it to members or put onto the website.

## Community Safety Partnership:

Bill Johnson, as the Chambers representative, gave a report on the last meeting:

- a) The Youth Shelter was having extra panels put in.
- b) The Youth Café pilot had moved back to the Phoenix Centre.
- c) The girls' football team is representing the area in a major competition.
- d) The decline in Anti-social behavior is a measure of success.
- e) There are two weekly surgeries at the Lakes School run by the Community Police Officer, PC Kevin Robinson.
- f) FA Coaching Staff were coming into the area to train the youngsters.
- g) Area Action Plan "Neighborhood Home Watch" funding had been secured up to 2009.
- h) The Fire Service had visited 177 homes in the area and fitted Smoke Alarms *free* of charge. They had a target of 244 this year.
- i) SLDT, through Paul Holdsworth, were looking into the cost of CCTV.
